It's budget time again and the 2012 budget will be even more challenging than previous budgets. The difference in 2012 is that we expect expenses to be higher having a full-time Pastor in place. But that is exciting news and we will find a way to make the budget work. This budget is also challenging because we are not quite sure what to expect for giving. The past several years Council has submitted a very conservative budget because anticipated receipts have been falling. But this coming year seems different. There is a lot of reason for optimism and our budget may reflect it.

There are several dynamics and plans in the works for 2012. Here are a few...

- ▶ Pastor Chris will provide excitement and stability for the congregation. The membership will be energized and attendance should increase.
- ▶ Council is planning a marketing campaign for Grace with the help of the Public Relations committee. The goal is to attract new members.
- ▶ Emphasis will be placed on organizing a Stewardship Committee lead by our Management & Internal Affairs Commission. This committee may combine with the Time & Talent Committee. This committee will be key to driving two important initiatives...
- ▶ Stewardship Campaign planned in Spring 2012. We have not had a stewardship campaign in several years. We want to separate the stewardship campaign from pledging and instead focus on our ministries.
- ▶ Encouraging greater involvement in the membership through time and talents. Being a member at Grace is so much more than just coming to church on Sundays.

There are ministries opportunities for everyone for every interest and stage in life.

- ▶ New traditions are being formed at Grace including continuation of the Bingo and Ice Cream Social and possibly the addition of a Homecoming celebration in May to mark the anniversary of our congregation. Special events such as these help unify the congregation as a church family.

The Finance Committee has made several recommendations for the Council to consider to help form an affordable budget. The budget this year may well be more optimistic than in prior years but for the reasons above along with some creative cost cutting ideas we will be able to come up with a budget that works well while maintaining our expected level of ministries.

It is sad to say goodbye to Pastor Anderson who has served us so well in the past year. We were all able to say a proper goodbye in her farewell luncheon on October 2nd after the services. Council did have a chance to give Pastor Anderson an exit interview to receive her wisdom on our ministries. We will use this information to guide our decisions going forward.

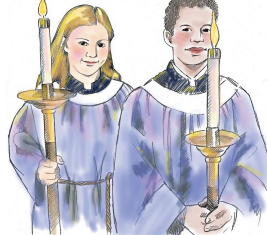
